Currently we have 30 children attending each time and we’d love to take more, especially as we sometimes have to turn people away. This is only possible if we have enough adults helping on the day. - Songs, stories and sometimes short talks/presentations relevant to the theme
- Large artwork activity

### ❖ Christian Aid Week

Many thanks to all of you that support Christian Aid Week. Last year we raised an amazing £1,643, of which £782 was from the door-to-door collecting, so well done those of you that collect on the streets. A further £544 was raised from the afternoon tea and cake sale. Last year was the first time we did an afternoon tea and approximately 50 people came, so it was a great success. We are holding another afternoon tea this year, which will be on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> May.

At this stage, we need volunteers for:

- helping with the afternoon tea on the day;
- street collecting. (The usual collectors on two of the roads that give the most and are 'easier roads' to collect on are not able to help this year, so we're keen not to lose the opportunity to collect on them. Can you help?)
