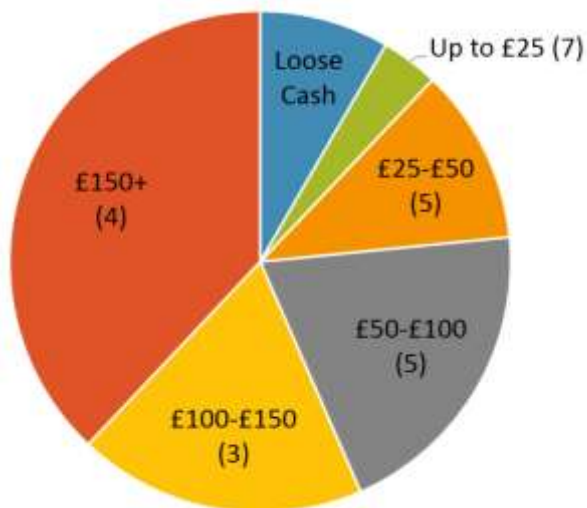


## Last Year (2015/2016)

Last year we finished with a surplus of about £1,000 on the church side of the accounts which was a really good position to be in. The total income from our regular offering was £23,000 which increased to £28,500 after Gift Aid had been claimed. This was enough to cover the Circuit Assessment (of £28,000) which it is always good to be able to do from the offertory.

The Circuit Assessment is something that we need to pay to allow the Circuit to support and enable Methodist work in Sheffield. It is spent on employing 20 Ministers, including 4 co-Supers, and a Deacon (plus the upkeep of 25 manses) and 4 mission resource team staff who in turn all support the 64 Methodist congregations across the city.

Below is a pie chart breaking down our offertory income for 2015/2016 showing amounts given per month, the number of people who gave that amount (in brackets) and how much of the £23,000 total this made up. For example, it shows that 4 people gave £150 or more per month and that this made up over a third of our total offertory income. This means that we are reliant on a small number of people and if one of them were to leave, move away, be made redundant or otherwise see a reduction in their income this will have a significant impact on our finances.

## This Year (2016/2017)

This year our part of Assessment has increased slightly to £28,275 but the amount that we expect to receive from the offertory has reduced to £21,500. With Gift Aid this brings the total offertory income to £26,500 which is almost £2,000 short of the Assessment figure. Just to break even we need to find an additional £2,000 but ideally would like to finish with a surplus to allow us to not just continue what we doing already, but to try new ideas and expand our work.

**We are therefore asking that people prayerfully review their regular offering to the church with a view to increasing it, if possible. We are very aware of the generosity of the congregation especially with our ongoing commitment to funding Claire and Tim to support the children, families and youth work. As the number of lives we touch continues to grow we fully understand that this may not be possible for everyone. Any other fundraising ideas will be gratefully received!**

If you do not currently give regularly and would like to start, popular methods are standing order or weekly offering envelope. If you are a UK taxpayer, your gift can be increased by 25% at no extra cost to yourself using Gift Aid.
