❖ The Bible Course

We'll be continuing 'The Bible Course' from this Thursday *18th October*. This is the Bible Society's overview of the whole Bible. It is an 8 session accessible and interactive course that will enhance and inform your ongoing Bible study, whether you are new to the Bible or want to go deeper. Using a unique storyline, the course shows how the key events, books and characters all fit together. You'll get to see the BIG picture and discover how the Bible applies to your life. We will start with a hot drink at 7:50 pm for an 8pm start and will meet in the Antioch Room. Everyone is welcome.

❖ Hope for Justice

It is estimated that worldwide there are 40.3 million people in modern day slavery, of which 13,000 are in the UK. Hope for Justice is a Christian charity that fights to eradicate modern day slavery and helps those that have been rescued or escaped trafficking to rebuild their lives. Andrea Killingsworth is a member of an Abolitionist group linked to Hope for Justice that mainly meets once a month on a Wednesday evening for prayer. They have been meeting for more than 3 years and it has been encouraging during that time to see both a greater awareness of the horror of this terrible crime and more happening to fight it, although there is still a long way to go. Their next meeting is on Wednesday 17th October. Please talk to Andrea if you are interested in joining them.
