THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK...

I've recently been sharing with you the views of the General Secretary of the Methodist Church, Rev Dr Martyn Atkins, that Methodism needs to see itself increasingly as 'A Discipleship Movement Shaped for Mission'. In order to do that we need to remind ourselves that the Methodist Church isn't so much the building we meet in but the people who meet there. It's very nearly impossible for a building to be a movement, but a group of people – that's much easier.

Our focus over the last few weeks & months has been in two main areas: firstly, the money that we committed to raise towards the maintenance of the building – the roof and the employment of Matt as Building Manager; and secondly our worship life here at Wesley Hall. These areas are essential for us in working out what it means to be God's people called Methodist here in Crookes, but only if we see them as vehicles for the mission which we share with God in this community. We don't meet here in order to maintain a building, nor do we maintain a building in order that we may meet here. The building is a resource for outreach to the community around us, nothing more. Similarly the worship we share is a way of engaging with God so that we might be equipped and inspired to reach out, and also a means of that outreach as we seek to provide an environment where people can be drawn closer to God. Worship is primarily not for our benefit, but for God's.

It is a great joy today to be celebrating this mission, as we welcome Steph, Beth & Tim into formal membership of this congregation, and to affirm and commission those who share in the pastoral work here. But let us not rest on our laurels: where are the next group of new members coming from?

Elsewhere in this Newsletter are details of the 'Talking of God' course that will be running during November here and at Walkley. Can I encourage as many of you as can to come along to these evenings, where together we can explore what it means to share our journey of discipleship with others.
