#### ❖ Christ Exploded

#### ❖ Exploring The Trust Model Of Church

There is a meeting this *Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> January* at 7:30pm in the Emmaus Room where we will be discussing our future as a church at Wesley Hall. A number of us recently visited Rawmarsh Methodist Church who have set up a charitable trust to run the church building thus freeing the congregation from the burdens and responsibilities of doing so themselves. Like us, they have a large building which is costly to run and maintain. Setting up a charitable trust has enabled a significant amount of funding to be brought in through grants and has enabled them to renovate parts of the building. We are also hoping to visit another church which has gone down a similar different route but operates as a faith based organisation.

If we grasp the opportunity of using the time that is freed up from looking after the building we could devote more time to mission. Also, our financial position is very precarious (this year we have made a loss of £9,000 and during the current year we are anticipating a loss of about £6,000) and on top of this we are faced with having to raise money to carry out essential renovations highlighted in our quinquennial report.

This is a really important meeting which could have a significant effect on the future of worship at Wesley Hall so please do your best to attend.

## Alpha Course: Does God exist?



# Alpha

Alpha is an opportunity for anyone to explore the Christian faith in a relaxed setting over ten thought-provoking weekly sessions. It is suitable for people who are either curious about the Christian faith or seeking and those who are Christians but feel they would benefit from a refresher or the opportunity to find out more about the main aspects of Christianity.

Each session begins with a meal - a chance to get to know others in the small group. There is then a short talk, which looks at different aspects of the Christian faith. This is followed by a time of discussion in the small groups, where everyone is welcome to contribute their opinion, ask questions and discuss with the rest of the group.
