## THIS WEEK...

### ❖ Jubilee Thank you

A big thank you to all those who helped with our flower festival last weekend. It was a great effort. ### ❖ Alpha

Wesley Ebenezer is running an Alpha course at Walkley. It will run mainly on Thursday evenings during June, the next session being this Thursday at 6.30pm. This is an opportunity for us to talk to others, and to ourselves, about what's important to us about the Christian faith. The course is designed so that we eat together, listen together, talk together and pray together as we explore the basics of our beliefs: who was Jesus and why did he die?; why is it important to pray and read the Bible?; how does the Holy Spirit help us to be followers of Jesus? The course is being run for two groups of people: those within the life of the church who want to know more about Jesus or to refresh themselves in the core beliefs and values of Christianity; and those who aren't yet a part of the church – our neighbours, friends or colleagues, whom we could invite to join us. Now is the time to start thinking about who you could invite along and to start praying for them. The good news of Jesus isn't just for the church: "The promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far off—for all that the Lord our God will call." (Acts 2:39). If there is someone you would like to invite, please pick up a flyer for them from the back of church giving details and dates.

### ❖ Safeguarding

As you will no doubt be aware Safeguarding – Creating Safer Spaces –for both Young People and Vulnerable Adults is very high on the Church's agenda. Every Methodist Circuit has been instructed to make sure that everyone who has any involvement, no matter how indirect or minor, with young people and vulnerable adults undertakes a 2½ hr. training session. This training must be completed by the end of August 2012. As a Circuit we have organised 6 training sessions and have already circulated the dates and a booking form. I am writing to invite you to attend a free consultation event we are holding in Manchester on 26 June 2012, on the topic of adoption and fostering. There are an estimated 6,800 children waiting to be adopted in the UK, and 8,750 more foster families are needed. Every child in this system has a tale to tell, but it usually involves a lot of pain and uncertainty. We realised that if every church in the UK could find someone to adopt or foster a child, then we'd make a huge difference. As a first step we are holding some consultation events to get people's views, experiences and stories to help us take this exciting idea forward and make it one that will work.
