## COMING SOON

### ❖ **Streets Of Light Trail 2021: Monday 25th to Sunday 31st October**

You may be aware that our friends at St Thomas' next door have pioneered the 'Streets of Light' trail, which has grown over the last 5 years. The idea is to decorate one (or more) windows of your house, flat or workplace and then leave the lights on from 4:30pm to 9:30pm, so our friends, neighbours and communities can see our beautiful light-filled displays. Your design can be anything you like, but should include one or more of the words LIGHT, LOVE or HOPE somewhere within it. At a time when most people are celebrating and focusing on Halloween, the Streets of Light initiative aims to shine God's light, turning streets of darkness and fear into streets of light, love and hope. STC are encouraging those people who will be decorating a window to sign up by midnight on Sunday 10th October, via the Streets of Light website <https://www.streetsoflight.co.uk/>, or there is a postal form that can be completed and dropped into St Thomas' Church. Those who sign up by the deadline will be included in the trail booklet. They have 10,000 to give out this year. The booklet will contain mini trails across different areas of Sheffield. If you sign up after 10th, don't worry as you will still be added to the interactive map on the website. Your address will be used to create the online interactive map but will not be shared with anyone else. ### ❖ Request from Neil Harland

Neil recently attended a JPIT (Joint Public Issues Team) webinar about the Nationality & Borders Bill currently undergoing scrutiny by parliamentary committee. Significant fears expressed by many churches that this bill will create more injustices in the asylum system, increasing the trauma and pain experienced by asylum seekers attempting to reach safety in the UK, are described at <https://www.jointpublicissues.org.uk/nationalityandbordersbill/>. Paul Bloomfield (Sheffield Central) is a member of the scrutiny committee, and so potentially has some opportunity to mitigate the worst elements of this legislation. JPIT are very keen to speak urgently with any of Paul's constituents who would be willing to contact Paul and express their concerns to him, especially if they have experience or knowledge of the asylum system. If anyone is willing to do this, please could they contact Steve Tinning from JPIT at [stinning@baptist.org.uk](mailto:stinning@baptist.org.uk) who can speak with them about how best to articulate specific concerns to Paul.

A number of members at Wesley Hall will be constituents of Paul's. This new legislation would have made it much harder for people such as Moj and Mehrab, who many at Wesley Hall know, to have received permission to stay in the UK. If there are many people willing and able to help, it may best if one representative from the congregation arranges a conversation with Steve.

Last Easter we created a witness to the people of Crookes by making and distributing handmade daffodils to people with a connection to Wesley Hall, and into the community in general by hanging them on railings etc around the area for people to take. We gave away nearly 300 daffodils, and several people saw and heard appreciative messages in different ways.

The Leadership Team have given their consent to our doing something similar at Christmas, using stars as our theme. We hope that people might knit, crochet, sew, or create stars in paper, card, wood, metal or any other medium, so that we could turn them into something that would hang on a tree or in a window or anywhere the recipient chooses. If we start thinking and planning now, then we have some time to create the stars before we distribute them in the week before Christmas.
