❖ **Christian Aid Week**

This year Christian Aid week will be from 13<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> May and the funds raised will go to help internally displaced people. Of the 65 million displaced people in the world, 40 million are displaced within their own countries. There will be a special focus on Haiti, which suffered an earthquake in 2010 and hurricanes in 2016 and 2017. How very fortunate we are in comparison! On the afternoon of *Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> May* there will be an afternoon tea which for the last 2 years has helped greatly in making up for the lower amount being raised from door to door collections. Last year, a total of £1,801.05 was raised which I think may be the highest ever. # Wesley Ebenezer General Fund



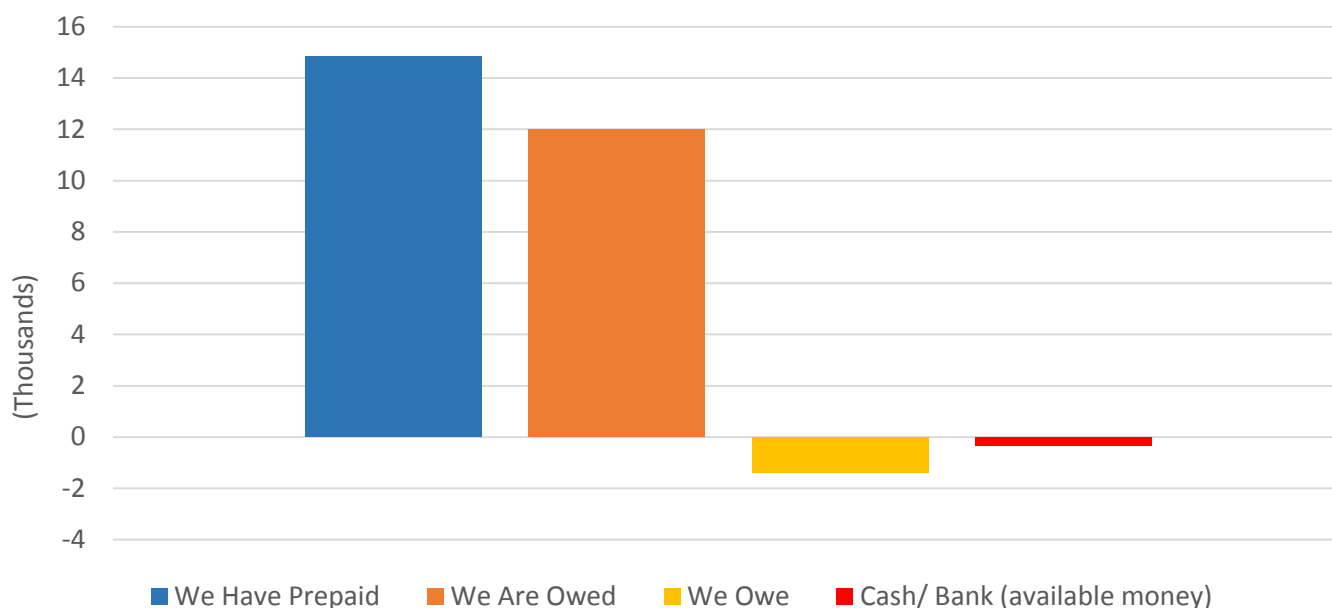

We have just submitted our accounts for last year (September 2016 to August 2017) for examination so they will be ready well before all the deadlines that we need to meet. However, this process has highlighted that the amount of money in our General Fund is sometimes quite far below the level we would like it to be at.

All unrestricted donations and income go into the General Fund (mostly our offering, Gift Aid and room hire) and this is then used to pay our Circuit Assessment, fund mission initiatives and run the building. Any money given specifically to other funds (e.g. the Children, Families and Youth Fund via our Gift Day) is not included in the General Fund. Our reserves policy states that we would like to hold enough money in the General Fund to cover between 3 and 6 months of our expenditure. Last year, total expenditure from the General Fund was around £126,000, so we are looking to hold between £31,500 and £63,000.

However, at year end we only had £25,105 in the General Fund so we are £6,500 short of the lower end of our policy. This is starting to distract from other priorities since we have to pay the Circuit Assessment quarterly and upfront (so need money to cover this) and all of our room hire is billed only after people have used the room. At year end we had no available money in the General Fund, since all of the £25,105 was made up of money we had prepaid (mostly Circuit Assessment), money owed to us (mostly for room hire) or money we owed (balance of credit card).

## General Fund Breakdown at Year End (Total £25,105)



We are now producing monthly finance reports so that we can closely monitor our income and expenditure and try to make sure we finish this year at break even or better so that we do not fall further behind. But, even looking a number of years ahead, it is unlikely that we will be able to generate enough of a surplus to increase the General Fund balance to where we would like it to be.

**Because of this, we are asking if anyone is able to make a one off donation to help us to bring the General Fund balance closer to our reserves policy. We are very aware of the generosity of the congregation, especially with our ongoing commitment to funding our children, families and youth work. As the number of lives we touch continues to grow we fully understand that this may not be possible for everyone. Any other fundraising ideas will be gratefully received!**
