❖ Vision Exploration Meeting

Following on from our very positive congregational meeting in January, we need to look at things in a little more detail and start to flesh out the community chaplain idea and explore how it will fit in our current structure, or if that structure needs to change. Please consider getting involved with this prayer for Sheffield initiative being organised by Sheffield Together (www.sheffieldarise.org), on their website is a short video that explains what the prayer walk is about. The aim is between *1st to 31st March* for someone to do a prayer walk on every road in Sheffield and then an Easter card will be delivered by Royal Mail to each household in Sheffield with information for people who want to know more. You can sign up on the website now and from 1st March say which road you will do a prayer walk on. I think this is a brilliant idea as lockdown is making more people open to God, thanks Andrea.

❖ Daffodils!

A few weeks ago, Liz Jenkinson watched a TV programme about people who use craft to get across a message to others. It set her thinking about the churches who leave knitted angels around their community at Christmastime, with a message of hope and love for whoever may find one.

That set Liz wondering whether at Wesley Hall we might do something different from the usual ways of engaging with our community (that we do when there is not a pandemic), and if we might do it by way of crafted daffodils for Easter.
