An exhibition of sculpture depicting the stages of grief and loss to be held from *3rd to 30th August* at 35, Chapel Walk, off Fargate. Born out of Jean Parker's own experience of cancer, "Good Grief" presents a powerful and unique visual exploration of the grief process relating not only to loss of health, but also to significant loss of any kind.

The exhibition aims to stimulate discussion about the powerful emotions experienced after loss, which can feel overwhelming. Visualised as a process of transitional stages, "Good Grief" hopes to provide reassurance through highlighting a common human experience whilst offering glimpses of hope when all seems lost.
