❖ Holy Habits

The Holy Habits programme has now started, and we are thinking about prayer for September and October. We hope that everyone will join together to pray on a Tuesday evening for church and our community. Below is a prayer for us to use and each month we will have a theme to focus on. The theme for this month is our work with older people, thinking particularly of Lunch Club and the monthly service at Mary Tozer.

We will be starting 'The Bible Course' from this *Thursday 4th October* at church, this is the Bible Society's overview of the whole Bible. It is an 8 session accessible and interactive course that will enhance and inform your ongoing Bible study, whether you are new to the Bible or want to go deeper. Using a unique storyline, the course shows how the key events, books and characters all fit together. You'll get to see the BIG picture and discover how the Bible applies to your life.

We will start with a hot drink at 7:50 pm for an 8pm start and will meet in the Antioch Room. Everyone is welcome, although to get the most out of the course you will need a study guide which will need ordering at a cost of £5 plus postage. - ❖ **Wesley Hall Toddler Group** is from 10am-11:30am on Wednesdays and includes a variety of stations, a small together time and a snack.
- ❖ The **First Steps Toddler Group** at Walkley Ebenezer is on Tuesday from 1-2:30pm and on Thursdays from 10-11:30am.
- ❖ **Stay and Play** is a community event with a bouncy castle, café and crafts. It's a free drop in event. We would love to see any old or new faces there! The next one is on Saturday 6th October (with a musical theme). We will need people to help with setting up, clearing away, with crafts and in the kitchen. At the summer Stay and Play we had a large volume of new people, and whilst we had enough volunteers to run the event the main thing we needed was more people to chat to people. For a large number of people Stay and Play may be the only contact they have with Wesley Hall and it would be wonderful if Stay and Play could be an extension of the warm hospitality which is present on a Sunday morning.

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❖ **Mission Forum Launch**

Representatives from each of the eight circuits in our district met together in July to discuss our mission and what we need to do so that each of our churches and circuits might flourish.

Each circuit shared its hopes, dreams and visions. We spoke about the surprising wealth of resources we have across our 161 churches, including our 40 ordained ministers, similar number of specialist lay employees, 6,000 members and £7m cash reserves. Rev Paul Wood (our national Ministry Development Co-ordinator) led us in exploring the myriad things our ministers find themselves doing, and we voted for the most important (envisioning others, worship leading, teaching, being a focal point for the ministry of the church, pastoral care and listening, since you ask).

We spent the afternoon discussing the opportunities and challenges we face, how we may need to "shake the dust off our boots", and new things we should be moving into. We considered what we should do next to see our visions realised, and how circuits and churches will need to help each other in this. A number of initial practical steps were agreed, including an expanded mission forum gathering in the next few months. We left enthused, challenged, and grateful to Central Aston-cum-Aughton for their hospitality. Watch this space for further details!"
