A number of us recently visited The Crossing which is a Methodist/URC LEP that has set up a Social Enterprise Company (SEC) who they then employ to manage the building on their behalf. Any revenue generated from lettings then goes back to the church, and not the SEC, so they are able to use the building to generate funds for the church. This is a different approach to that adopted by Rawmarsh and we will be looking at whether either of these models is appropriate for Wesley Hall, and what our next step should be.

This is a really important meeting which could have a significant effect on the future of worship at Wesley Hall so please do your best to attend.

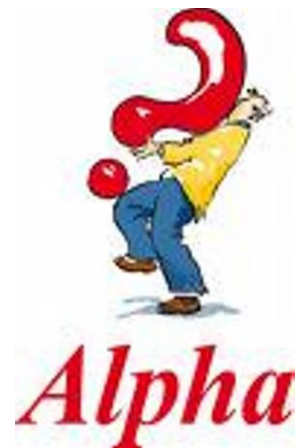
Second week of ALPHA...
