Lent Groups

All are invited to join the Lent Study for the Methodist Churches of Dore, Totley Rise and Wesley Hall, led by Rev. Mike Jones. During the course we will look at Bible passages, listen to ideas from Dr Carmody Grey (which she has written and recorded in the course material), and share our own thoughts in discussion together. Each session will be no longer than 90 minutes. ❖ Arise Prayer Walk: Wednesday 1st March to Friday 31st March

Christians across Sheffield are being invited to cover the city in prayer this March to help connect with the needs of people living there.

Arise:March's theme in 2023 is to cover, discover and recover; to cover our streets in prayer, discover local prayer needs, and recover the true meaning of Easter for Sheffield. This is the third year that Arise has invited people across Sheffield to prayer-walk and bring hope to the city. An app has been developed to coordinate the efforts of everyone taking part, which creates a map of the routes that have been prayer-walked. The more a street is prayed for, the brighter it will glow on the app. This year people will also be able to upload the prayer needs they have discovered to the Arise:March prayer app so others can join in prayer for those needs. However, you don't need the app to take part. The whole essence of Arise is to cover Sheffield in prayer; you can do that without leaving your own home!

Turkey-Syria Earthquake Emergency Donations

I am sure we have all been moved by the unfolding events of the catastrophic earthquakes in Turkey, causing thousands of structures to crumble in both southern Turkey and north-western Syria. The seismic shock was followed by numerous strong after-shocks, and another quake hit the area nine hours later. According to reports, the disaster has claimed thousands of lives, with officials anticipating the death toll to increase.

All We Can (the Methodist Church's international development and relief organisation) will be responding to the earthquake and rescue efforts. Their initial response is centred in Syria, as they already have access to existing networks for the most vulnerable, through their partners in the region. All We Can have supported refugees prior to the earthquake and will continue to support them during this time of extended vulnerability.
