Liz is running the Sheffield Half!

I have agreed to run the Sheffield Half marathon (21km/13 miles) on *Sunday 14th April*, which is fairly daunting...

It's the furthest I have ever run (I've done one 10km and a couple of 5km races before), and I reckon I'll be pretty slow, but I will be attempting to run the whole thing. I am raising money for a couple of causes: The Shark Trust and Moorend Place. Moorend Place is the nursing home taking good care of Brian Mills and others in Sheffield with dementia. The money raised will go towards their activities fund so they can take residents out more often. The Shark Trust works to conserve sharks around the world. Sharks are in real trouble from overfishing and a cruel practice called finning to meet demand in the East for shark fin soup. Without action, some species of these fantastic animals could become extinct. You are most welcome to donate to either or both causes. Christian Aid is a Christian charity committed to overseas development and helping poorer countries. They work closely with overseas partners towards their goal of ending poverty and injustice. For the past few years, in order to supplement the monies raised from the door-to-door collections (which have gone down as fewer people have been able to do the street collections), an afternoon tea has been held.
