The Circuit Prayer Gathering will be taking place this Wednesday from 8pm to 9pm via Zoom and all are welcome:




COMING SOON

Boiler Update

Work to replace our boilers has now begun, so we will be without heating in the building for up to two weeks. Please pray for mild weather to reduce the impact this will have on the many groups that meet here. Once the work is complete, we will have a new heating system ready for the winter.

❖ Methodist Training: Unconscious Bias, Equality, Diversity & Inclusion

As part of the Methodist Church's commitment to being inclusive and justice-seeking, we are now looking to implement life-long learning about the richness of human diversity and to learning from one another. To help us with this, the Methodist Church has produced two new training modules. The training is mandatory for our Leadership Team, Worship Leaders and Lay Workers, but everyone, especially those who hold a role within the church (e.g. Church Council members, Worship Stewards and Welcome Stewards) are warmly invited to complete it as well.

It is possible to complete the course online at your own pace by going to https://mcb.theologyx.com/courses/, where you will need to register for a free account (you may have already used MCBX for the Advanced Safeguarding Course). The training is made up of

two parts: the Unconscious Bias Training; and the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Module. Or if you prefer, Michelle is running an in-person course at Wisewood Methodist Church at 10:30am on *Saturday 13th January* (please book with the Circuit Office on 0114 272 6561).

Once you have completed either of the courses, please let Matt know so he can keep a record of it.
