### ❖ MISSION: Rescue

On Friday 31st May, we (15 children aged 5-11 and a group of wonderful helpers) spent the day exploring the Story of Moses. We acted out how the baby in the basket was discovered and became a prince before seeing the amazing events later in his life via film clips: the Burning Bush encounter that sent him on God's rescue mission and the climax of the parting of the Red Sea and leading the Israelites to freedom. We made burning bush stained glass windows, weaved baskets, made some pretty darn good chocolate cookies and decorated Pharaoh masks.

We also played silly games and used our bodies to make freeze frames of events in the story during a drama workshop run by an actress from the Lantern Theatre. There was also much singing and dancing and a race around the building to find and assemble pictures from the Exodus story into the correct order. Finally we made a lot of mess completing a montage of MISSION: Rescue story on a double sheet. Many, many thanks to all the helpers and I hope you all enjoyed it as much as I did! Liz

### ❖ **Card at the back of Church from the Drop In Team**

"To all at Wesley Hall,

Very many thanks for all your generous gifts towards God's work at our drop in centre.

We feed around 40-50 people every Wednesday evening. Each person is given a hot meal plus pudding and a pair of socks as many homeless people have very bad feet, often with sores. We also give a sandwich pack with various fillings and a choc bar to take away. Tea, coffee, chocolate and juice are served throughout the evening. Second hand clothing is also handed out plus shoes and bedding. We do not charge any money, as most of who come do not have any.

We do not have grants from anywhere but God has always provided without us ever having to advertise or ask. People like yourselves who hear about this ministry and respond so kindly. So once again thank you for your kind and loving response. The Drop In Centre Team"
