

❖ **Worship in the Building – COVID Precautions**

❖ **Early Farewell Service**

The Revs. Tim Crome and Mark Goodhand are seeking permission to 'sit down' at this year's Conference which mean their appointments in the Sheffield Circuit will come to an end in the summer of this year. Tim will be staying in Sheffield Circuit as a Supernumerary Presbyter and Mark will be retiring to the Northampton District.

Tim was appointed Superintendent of the former Ecclesall Circuit in 2012 and served as Co-Superintendent in the Sheffield Circuit from its inception until 2020.

Mark was appointed Superintendent of the former Pilgrim Circuit in 2008 and also served as Co-Superintendent in the Sheffield Circuit until stepping down from that role in 2019.

In recognition of their service to the Methodist Church in Sheffield we will present Tim and Mark with gifts at a Circuit Farewell service to be held somewhat earlier in the year than usual, as both Tim and Mark will be taking their sabbaticals in the final months of this connexional year. The service will be this *Sunday 10th April* at Firth Park at 6:30pm.
