❖ **Streets Of Light Trail 2021: Monday 25th to Sunday 31st October**

You may be aware that our friends at St Thomas' next door have pioneered the 'Streets of Light' trail, which has grown over the last 5 years. The idea is to decorate one (or more) windows of your house, flat or workplace and then leave the lights on from 4:30pm to 9:30pm, so our friends, neighbours and communities can see our beautiful light-filled displays. Your design can be anything you like, but should include one or more of the words LIGHT, LOVE or HOPE somewhere within it.

At a time when most people are celebrating and focusing on Halloween, the Streets of Light initiative aims to shine God's light, turning streets of darkness and fear into streets of light, love and hope.

STC are encouraging those people who will be decorating a window to sign up by midnight on Sunday 10th October, via the Streets of Light website <https://www.streetsoflight.co.uk/>, or there

is a postal form that can be completed and dropped into St Thomas' Church. Those who sign up by the deadline will be included in the trail booklet. They have 10,000 to give out this year. The booklet will contain mini trails across different areas of Sheffield. If you sign up after 10th, don't worry as you will still be added to the interactive map on the website. Your address will be used to create the online interactive map but will not be shared with anyone else.
