❖ Church Review

You may remember that a few years ago we underwent a Church Review as a part of a Circuit initiative, and to help us to move forward with our mission and vision. We are being asked to revisit that review this year with a slightly different process and focus. The Circuit staff are working together in pairs to enable a second stage review to take place. Wesley Hall and Walkley Ebenezer are being asked to work together as a part of the discernment process for the best way of moving forward together.

The initial meeting is on *Saturday 24th March* from 10:30am–12:00pm and will be held at Wesley Hall (room to be confirmed). ❖ Crookes Holiday Club

This Easter we are organizing our Crookes Holiday Club together with St. Tim's. It is St. Tim's turn to host and we are looking for volunteers for 1, 2 or 3 days. Volunteers are needed for overseeing children and teenagers, accompanying them to outdoor activities, helping to set up and tidying up, helping with the food, snacks and many other things. The Holiday Club will take place on *Monday 9th, Tuesday 10th and Wednesday 11th April*. Please speak to Tim or Liz if you are able to help.

❖ Christian Aid Week

This year Christian Aid week will be from 13th to 19th May and the funds raised will go to help internally displaced people. Of the 65 million displaced people in the world, 40 million are displaced within their own countries. There will be a special focus on Haiti, which suffered an earthquake in 2010 and hurricanes in 2016 and 2017. How very fortunate we are in comparison! On the afternoon of *Saturday 19th May* there will be an afternoon tea which for the last 2 years has helped greatly in making up for the lower amount being raised from door to door collections. Last year, a total of £1,801.05 was raised which I think may be the highest ever. At this stage I would really appreciate offers of help with the afternoon tea so please let me know if this is something you can offer to do. God bless, Andrea Killingsworth.
