Thank You & Goodbye to Jane

Just to let you all know that I am leaving my role as Youth Worker at Wesley Hall and will finish by the February half term.

I feel really bad about leaving so soon but I realised soon after starting it wasn't possible for me. On paper the bus journey from Dinnington to Crookes looked fine (a total of 3 hours return which I thought was OK) but in reality with many buses being cancelled and bad traffic, plus having to wait in the dark at the Interchange where I just missed a bus or it was cancelled sometimes meaning an hour wait and then walking through a dark town centre were too much

for me. It was taking me 2 hours to get to work and around 3 to get home which is a total of 5 hours travelling.

As it was a part time job of 14 hours I thought it would be easy to combine with my other work, the anti-trafficking task force I've set up and my international speaking, but this has taken off faster than I could have imagined, meaning lots of travel abroad, being part of a work team with the UN, the OSCE and the WHO. The youth need consistency and not me being away a week every month, so I decided to step down from my role at Wesley Hall.

Working with your young people has been a lovely experience as they are amazing and it's been an honour to get to know them. The Drop Inn youth are a great bunch and many good things have happened and its awesome that Wesley Hall does this and has such good contact with schools in the area. The school Assistant Head has told me they are so happy to have this contact.

The volunteers at both WHY and Drop Inn are inspiring as they work so hard and are committed to the youth. Matt has been amazing too and was a massive support and help and I see his heart for Wesley Hall. It has been lovely getting to know Mike too and watch him connect with WHY and Drop in and see his heart for the youth.

I won't forget Wesley Hall and the lovely welcome I had and I'm sorry to leave. Lots of love to you all x Jane.

❖ Turkey-Syria Earthquake Emergency Donations

I am sure we have all been moved by the unfolding events of the catastrophic earthquake in Turkey causing thousands of structures to crumble in both southern Turkey and north western Syria. The seismic shock was followed by numerous strong aftershocks, and another guake hit the area nine hours later. According to reports, the disaster has claimed over thousands of lives, with officials anticipating the death toll to increase in the coming days.

All We Can (the Methodist Church's international development and relief organisation) will be responding to the earthquake and rescue efforts. Their initial response is centred in Syria given access to existing networks for the most vulnerable, through their partners in the region. All We Can have supported refugees prior to the earthquake and will continue to support them during this time of extended vulnerability.



The day started with a welcome and a time of worship with a band followed by a small God talk by guest speaker Colly Kamili. After this we all split into different groups and there were workshops to go to on different subjects, such as social justice, prayer, quiet times and many more. It was then time for question time and fun and then lunch which was subway rolls,

cookies and crisps. After lunch we had a brilliant afternoon with many activities to choose from, a photo booth, TV studio where groups could make small films together, circus skills, crafts and a football & basketball shootout. In one room was even a nerf shootout. Outside was a cavepod where you had to crawl through like a cave diver, it looked scary but WHY youth were very brave and all had a go. The afternoon ended with another time of worship and prayer. Louise, Jonathan and I loved spending the day with WHY and other youth and youth workers and we all had an amazing day. Jane.
