Dear Friends,

First may I say how lovely it is to be able to start this letter in that way and to call you friends. In many ways it is a thank you for the way that I have been made so welcome among you and as I slowly get to know you better.

Second I am writing this near to the beginning of 2017, so may I take this chance to wish you all a very happy New Year and add my prayers that it might be filled with many blessings.

I don't know about you but I am unsure whether to celebrate a New Year or hide from it, there always seem to be more things to do and more challenges to be faced, that said we can be thankful and confident that we do not enter into it alone, but can step out in confidence with the one who calls us to take his yoke upon us as we do so, with the promise that the yoke is easy and the burden is light! (Matthew 11: 28-30).

So how then do we step out together, one of the challenges offered to us by the Circuit review was to consider our Methodist Identity and what that might mean for us as a church. Many churches hold their Covenant Services at this time of year, and while we don't it might be good to be reminded of the beginning of that Covenant prayer which invites us to begin with the words:

***"I am no longer my own but yours"***

In doing so we give ourselves again to the wonderful covenant relationship that God invites us into, a relationship based on deep promises and a love that holds and keeps us when we allow it to do so, this like all relationships requires us to play our part or it is no relationship at all. Playing our part takes many forms of course and we respond to God every day in how we live our lives as well as through intentional worship, prayer, and service. We will be looking at this in some way in our Congregational Meeting on the 5<sup>th</sup> February directly after the morning service. In that meeting we will consider aspects of church life and discipleship with a special emphasis on the call to radical generosity and how this enables the mission of God to be taken forward.

One thing I would personally like to establish is a weekday, daytime fellowship/ Bible Study group. I would welcome your thoughts on that.

Lastly, I would like to invite you to drop into the Manse which is at 8 Reservoir Rd, S10 1EY, on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> February between 11am and 4pm, just to say hello, to enjoy some refreshments etc. Come and go as you feel comfortable. Everyone is welcome, including children of all ages, it is my way of saying thank you, and if you want an excuse it can be your way of helping me to celebrate my birthday, though candles on cakes are not to be counted!

So, thank you again, let us continue to pray and work towards seeing a full expression of the love of God among us.
