❖ Vine at Home Service

❖ Methodist Church in Britain Worship at Home

❖ Wesley's Chapel - Livestream

❖ Ken Ruffle

It is Ken's funeral in Cwmbran on Monday 18th May at 4pm. Please pray for his family, especially those who are unable to attend in person. As Ken was such an integral part of Wesley Hall, and the whole family have connections here, they would like to join us for a celebration of his life, when it is safe and appropriate to do so, hopefully in the autumn.

❖ Mission Development

In his role as Sheffield District Mission Development Support Worker, Neil Harland has asked us to publicise a series of conversations he is hosting about various aspects of church life. From Neil: "What really matters? We've probably all been asking such questions recently. How does my church or circuit respond to the good news of God's love in Christ today, next month, next year? What does it mean to live and breathe a life of worship and mission? In an uncertain and changing world, your District is here to equip and support you learning, changing and joining-in. Back in the olden days before lockdown (January and February) a group of people with varied experiences from across our circuits met to discuss where our new priorities should lie in this. Six themes emerged, which feel more relevant than ever now. We need now to test and refine this emerging vision, and to do this need to hear as wide a range of perspectives and experiences as possible. If one of these subjects is what gets you out of bed in the morning, or someone has told you that your gifts lie in this area, we would be really grateful if you could join the conversation. The days and times given are suggestions. If you want to be part of a conversation but the logistics don't work for you, please let me know and I will find a way to include you. Meetings will be held via Zoom and are open to anyone who feels they have something to contribute."

Neil is keen to draw our attention to the session about '**Growing Disciples**' on Wednesday 20th May at 10am, which will include the following:

- Fostering small group and personal discipleship (vocation and mission flows from personal relationship with Christ)
- Nurturing leaders (realising visions not filling roles)
- Local learning (equipping disciples to meet contextual needs)

The sessions for the other emerging themes are:

- **Sharing Stories** - Mon 18th May, 2pm
- **Passionate Contextual Worship** - Thurs 21st May, 2pm
- **Transforming Mission** - Tues 26th May, 4pm
- **Properties Fit for Mission** - Wed 27th May, 10am
- **Simplifying Procedures** - Thurs 28th May, 10am
