❖ Church Hall Tables

The Kumon group that now meet at Wesley Hall to provide maths and English tuition on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons are struggling to get chairs and tables set up in time for their Thursday meeting. ❖ Update on Roof Works

The total cost of the works required on the Wesley Hall roof is around £280,000. Through the 20 in 12 challenge we have raised over £20,000 of this and the Circuit have approved a grant of £65,000. We have now heard back from the National Churches Trust and Methodist Insurance, neither of whom awarded us a grant. Over the next few months, applications for grant assistance towards the roof works will be submitted to the Sheffield District, Sheffield Town Trust, Methodist Fund for Property, All Churches Trust, WREN, Veolia and English Heritage. We will then review the situation early next year (when will have heard back from most of these organisations) and see how much money is available. Ideally we would like to go ahead with the full project but if there is a shortfall in the funds, we will work with our architect to address the most urgent issues.

Please can you pray that:

- our applications will contain the information that each different funder is looking for
- our applications will be successful!
- we will be awarded enough money to make the roof watertight again
- there will not be any further leaks or damage over the winter period

❖ **Hearing Aid Loop**

Our hearing aid loop has been looked at this week so the volume received in hearing aids should now be much louder. If you would like to use the hearing loop, simply switch your hearing aid to the 'T' setting.

❖ **God in the Everyday**
