The Zooms are taking place on Thursdays, with the third session this *Thursday 25th April* at 8:00pm. The Zoom details are below:



ROLES TO FILL

At the AGM, we will vote to approve the appointments of those who serve on the various groups and committees that enable Wesley Hall to function as a church. We are always looking for new people to get involved in the running of the church so have a look at the list and see if there is anything that takes your fancy. Most groups are open to anyone, but only church members can serve on Church Council and Circuit Meeting.

Worship Steward

Currently, the role involves making email contact with the preacher before the Sunday service, finding volunteers to read the bible readings, passing information on to the musicians and AV operatives, and then arriving earlier on a Sunday morning to arrange the Sanctuary ready for worship, greet the preacher and, after the service, count the offering. However, the role can be flexible and tailored to your own skill set, so please don't be put off if there's are any parts you're worried about. You could expect to be a worship steward approximately once every 4 weeks or so.

❖ Leadership Team

The Leadership Team meet monthly to plan events and discuss issues about the running and future of the church. The team is quite small, and its membership have been serving for a long time, so it would be great to see some new faces with new ideas!

Church Council Representatives

Our Church Council usually meets three times a year and is the Trustee body where decisions about the church are made. If you are interested in finding out more about what happens at Wesley Hall, then you would be very welcome to join.

Circuit Meeting Representatives

The Circuit Meeting meets four times a year at churches around Sheffield and is the Trustee body where decisions about the Circuit are made. We currently have a vacancy for a representative.

Centre Manager Management Group

This body meets about four times a year to look at the finance and property issues that make up the bulk of Matt's work.

❖ Families & Community Co-ordinator Management Group

This body meets every six to eight weeks to oversee and review the groups and events that make up the bulk of Jacque's work.

❖ Pre-teen & Youth Management Group

The next task for this body will (hopefully) be to recruit and interview our new youth worker. It will likely then meet every six to eight weeks to oversee and review the youth related groups and events.

❖ Gift Day 2024

We have committed our annual Gift Days to supporting the employment of both a Families Co-Ordinator and a Pre-teen & Youth Worker.

About a third of the income for the Children, Families and Youth Fund comes from our Gift Day. Our target for this year is £8,000, with £1,400 already received from those who make a regular gift each month. However, we have not yet managed to secure all the grant funding we had hoped for, so if it is possible to increase your donation from last year, that would be fantastic, although we do completely understand that there are many other pressures on people's finances at the moment.

Cliff Festival 2024

Cliff Festival 2024 runs from *Friday 24th – Monday 27th May* at Cliff College in Derbyshire. Expect morning and evening worship and Bible teaching, seminars, games and activities for people of all ages, opportunities to be reenergised and resourced for mission – and all in the stunning surrounds of the Peak District. The theme this year is Rerouted and the morning bible studies will be led by Matt Miofsky from the Gathering Church in Missouri. Other contributors will be announced shortly and closer to the event the programme will be available on the Cliff College website. They run excellent youth and children's work provision for children aged 2 and upwards.

There is the option to visit for the day as well as buying a ticket for the whole weekend (entry is free to all under 18s). Day passes are £25 for adults or £18 for concessions (65 or over/ students/ living with a disability or on benefits). We won't be having a service here at Wesley Hall on Sunday 26th May, so that would be a great opportunity to come and see what it is like!
