#### Cliff Festival 2023

Cliff Festival 2023 runs from *Friday 26<sup>th</sup>* – *Monday 29<sup>th</sup> May* at Cliff College in Derbyshire. Expect morning and evening worship and Bible teaching, seminars, games and activities for people of all ages, opportunities to be reenergised and resourced for mission – and all in the stunning surrounds of the Peak District. The theme this year is Eden Restored and the morning bible studies will be led by Dr Ruth Valerio. Other contributors will be announced shortly and closer to the event the programme will be available on the Cliff College website. They run excellent youth and children's work provision for children aged 2 and upwards.

There is the option to visit for the day as well as buying a ticket for the whole weekend (entry is free to all under 18s). Day passes are £22 for adults or £15 for concessions (65 or over/ students/ living with a disability or on benefits). We won't be having a service here at Wesley Hall on *Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> May*, so that would be a great opportunity to come and see what it is like!

## EASTER REFLECTION

On Holy Saturday 2022 I visited the former Maya centre at Lamanai, Belize. Among the many incredible facts we learned about the Maya was the account of how they came to leave their settlement by the New River Lagoon in 1534, after over three thousand years on the land. By then they had established a thriving trading centre and were well-established in an area stretching for ten miles on one side of the river. There were between forty and sixty thousand people living with customs, religion and vast temples that they had built over the years.

The Spanish attacked this community in 1534. The Maya repelled them but then made the incredible decision to leave. They knew the Spanish would be back with larger forces. We don't know how quickly they decided to leave or whether some stayed behind for a while but we know that, eventually, they all left and their homes, edifices and temples were left to the elements and to be overtaken by the forest.

The Maya sacrificed everything they had and all that they had established over three thousand years. They did not cling to the past but gave up everything in order to guarantee a future for the generations to come.

This Easter Weekend we have celebrated and rejoiced in the death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. We recall the sacrifice of the Lamb of God to take away the sins of the whole world. We revel in the resurrection and the new life that is ours in Christ.

Though the Maya knew little, if anything, of Christ's sacrificial love, they are people created in the image of God. To this day, there are still Maya in and around Belize because of the sacrifices of their people in 1534.

Settlements, centres and communities do not need to make such sacrifices to enjoy new life in Christ. It is Jesus who has made the sacrifice. We are invited to give him our lives so that we might know life in all its fullness. We die with Christ, that we might rise with Him. It is amazing what sacrifices previous generations have made for our sake but the sacrifice that is above all else is understood in the death of resurrection of Jesus who died, that we might live - and live eternally.

Hallelujah, Christ is risen!
