### ❖ The future for Palestine, 25 years after the Oslo Accords

An evening of information, discussion and Palestinian supper at St Andrews Psalter Lane Church on *Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> September*, from 6pm to 9pm

We welcome Rev John Howard, recently returned Mission Partner from Bethlehem/Jerusalem who has travelled widely in Israel and Palestine, including Gaza, and Caitlin Procter who has lived and worked in the West Bank and Gaza for much of the past 6 years.

In 1993, Yasser Arafat and Yitzhak Rabin signed the Oslo Accords. The aim was to develop Palestine into a state and to continue, over the next 5 years, to develop solutions to the status of Jerusalem, Israeli settlements, Palestinian refugees, borders and security. Twenty-five years on, none of these issues has been resolved, indeed settlements have increased massively and President Trump has decided that Jerusalem shall be the capital of Israel, contrary to international agreement. What are the issues and what is the future?

Both speakers will share their experience with slides and film. The buffet style supper will be served at 6pm – a meal of Palestinian traditional dishes, both vegetarian and meat.

### ❖ **Mission Forum Launch**

Representatives from each of the eight circuits in our district met together in July to discuss our mission and what we need to do so that each of our churches and circuits might flourish.

Each circuit shared its hopes, dreams and visions. We spoke about the surprising wealth of resources we have across our 161 churches, including our 40 ordained ministers, similar number of specialist lay employees, 6,000 members and £7m cash reserves. Rev Paul Wood (our national Ministry Development Co-ordinator) led us in exploring the myriad things our ministers find themselves doing, and we voted for the most important (envisioning others, worship leading, teaching, being a focal point for the ministry of the church, pastoral care and listening, since you ask).

We spent the afternoon discussing the opportunities and challenges we face, how we may need to "shake the dust off our boots", and new things we should be moving into. We considered what we should do next to see our visions realised, and how circuits and churches will need to help each other in this. A number of initial practical steps were agreed, including an expanded mission forum gathering in the next few months. We left enthused, challenged, and grateful to Central Aston-cum-Aughton for their hospitality. Watch this space for further details!"
