
'How to have better conversations about relationships and sex education; an online webinar for parents and those working with children and young people.'

Methodist Training: Unconscious Bias, Equality, Diversity & Inclusion

As part of the Methodist Church's commitment to being inclusive and justice-seeking, we are now looking to implement life-long learning about the richness of human diversity and to learning from one another. To help us with this, the Methodist Church has produced two new training modules. The training is mandatory for our Leadership Team, Worship Leaders and Lay Workers, but everyone, especially those who hold a roll within the church (e.g. Church Council members, Worship Stewards and Welcome Stewards) are warmly invited to complete it as well.

It is possible to complete the course online at your own pace by going to https://mcb.theologyx.com/courses/ where you will need to register for a free account (you may have already used MCBX for the Advanced Safeguarding Course). The training is made up of two parts: the Unconscious Bias Training; and the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Module. Or if you prefer, Michelle is running an in-person course at Wisewood Methodist Church at 10:30am on Saturday 13th January. Once you have completed either of the courses, please let Matt know so he can keep a record of it.

I am also very pleased to say that we have received a £2,000 grant from Sheffield Town Trust towards the car park. This means that we can now approach the Benefact Trust's Methodist Grants Programme for the remainder of the funds required.
