About 4 or 5 weeks ago my elder brother, Clifford, to my complete surprise, visited Wesley Hall's Lunch Club and was pleased by his reception. Unfortunately, the Monday following he had a bad fall and was immediately rushed to hospital where he died on Sunday 3rd November aged 87.

On Remembrance Sunday we remember the deaths of servicemen in particular. At the age of 17 Cliff was nursing the wounded from the D Day landings. Those people who know me well are aware that I view the dead and injured of any war as victims-not only servicemen but the millions of men, women and children-who were in the wrong place at the wrong time, this being the only reason for their fate.
