#### ❖ **Easter Card from Joan Frith**

#### ❖ **Messy Church Article**

You might remember that, after the Zoom service on Easter Sunday, Judith Simms mentioned that she was editing a magazine called "ArtServe". She explained that as part of this she had asked Claire to write an article about how Messy Church at Wesley Hall had operated over the last year during the Covid crisis. A copy of Claire's article is attached.

#### ❖ **Where is it now?**

Many of you may not know that Wesley Hall used to have a magnificent pipe organ. The organ was originally made by Albert Keates of Sheffield in 1928 for Wesley Hall. It was located roughly where the creche is now. When our worship area was moved into the Brice Hall the organ was sold in 1972. It was bought by St. Saviour's Church in Folkstone, which is now the home of the Harbour Church who no longer use the organ. According to an article in "KentOnline" they are now looking to relocate the organ to the Church of St. Gregory and St. Martin in Wye near Ashford. A picture of the organ in its current position is attached.

#### ❖ **Daffodils!**

Following the distribution of the daffodils around Crookes at Easter, Liz has written the following which was included in this week's Circuit Newsletter.



“Our mission statement at Wesley Hall, part of Wesley Ebenezer Church, is “Loving all People, Building Community and Sharing our Christian Faith”. With the restrictions placed upon us during the pandemic, we had to look for new ways of trying to fulfil our mission as we are unable to invite the community in for Lunch Club, Messy Church, Film Shows, Stay and Play, Wesley Wigglers, Big Lunch and the many other ways on our usual calendar.

We decided to try and take our witness into the community and so we knitted, crocheted, stitched, paper folded and crafted daffodils in any way we knew, to be given to anyone who might like to take one.

Each daffodil had an Easter greeting saying it was from Wesley Hall and also had a Biblical text of love and hope attached to it. In total we had approaching 300 flowers.

We distributed some through the bags given to Lunch Club members and Messy Church families and others went specifically to people who needed to know they are remembered. The rest were fastened to railings outside church, railings by the community garden near the shops on Crookes, on bus stops, school railings, the local park and Crookes cemetery. We topped them up each day through Holy Week and found them all taken by the next day.

We had positive feedback through messages on the community Facebook page, from a lady wearing her daffodil and from someone suffering with depression who felt she must go out for a walk at 10pm one night. She found a daffodil on the nearby railings, which brought her comfort and made her feel that was why she had to go out that night.

We hope we found one way to bring a socially distanced Easter witness to the community of Crookes.”

#### ❖ Christian Aid

Christian Aid aims to end poverty and injustice worldwide. Christian Aid week, which takes place each year in May, is a big part of their fundraising effort and in 2019 £8million was raised. Andrea Killingsworth has been coordinating Christian Aid week for Wesley Hall since 2009 and is looking to step down from doing this, although she will continue to support it. The main focus of the week has been the door-to-door collections during the week in May, but other fundraising activities have also taken place. However, how things are approached is not set in stone. If you want to know more about what is involved in coordinating Christian Aid week, please speak to Andrea.
