'Space on Saturday' at St Tim's




'Kids' Church' at St Tim's

FROM SALLY...

Dear Friends.

First, may I wish you all a very Happy New Year, and many blessings as we move into 2020, I realise that I am a little late in doing so, but the sentiment is the same. I do hope that you have all had a mostly enjoyable and peaceful Christmastime, I was sorry not to be with you, but due to personal illness that just wasn't possible.

It was my personal illness that has had a knock on effect going forward, and while we had planned to hold conversations on the God in Love Unites Us report that has been sent out to the whole of the Connexion by the Conference for consultation in January we have not had time to properly prepare for these. Therefore, I am offering two dates on Thursdays the 5th and 12th March, for us to consider the report. It covers all aspects of human relating and asks us to make some responses, which we can do both together if we wish to, and as individuals. Apologies because it is rather a long web-address. Alongside the report, we also have leaflets from MET (Methodist Evangelicals Together) and from Dignity and Worth (a group who affirm those in the LGBTQI community and their supporters) I would encourage you to read all of the available materials prayerfully and carefully.

The purposes of the consultation are not to change anybody's mind on any of the topics contained in the report, which include, marriage, singleness, cohabitation, divorce, and same-sex partnerships, all of which are treated with compassion and care. The questions we are being asked are about how we might live together as Methodist people with differing opinions and views.

I am very happy to talk to anybody about my own stance on all these areas of human relating, but not with a view to changing your mind, but with the desire to listen to you and respect who and where you are. I believe that this would very much be Jesus' way, and that when he called people to follow him that he was calling them to a transformative journey that would be different for each one. The gospels have no one size fits all blueprint for salvation, beyond the deep call to love and to serve one another.

I do encourage you to come to this consultation meetings which will be held at Wesley Hall on Thursdays 5th March & 12th March: 7:00pm for refreshments; 7:30pm start; finish at 9:30pm.

As we prepare for these meetings, let us hold one another in love and in care.
