## **A LETTER FROM SALLY...**

Dear Friends,

I can hardly believe that it is almost the end of January. Time seems to be flying quickly by. As far as Holy Habits is concerned, we will be moving from focusing on the habit of Gladness and Generosity to the habit of Breaking Bread. But before we do that, I would like to offer some reflections. When we ponder Gladness and Generosity, we have often focused on God's generosity to us and our glad response, which can be shown in many ways, including through acts of generous gift giving and sharing - a habit highlighted by your generous responses to the Parson Cross Initiative Foodbank appeal at Christmas-time.

I do reflect, however, that very often what we don't talk about is the elephant in the room, and that is money. Somehow that is a taboo and very personal subject, and perhaps needs challenging by Jesus' words "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6: 21). This of course is a challenge that requires much reflection from us, and it certainly is not me trying to make anyone feel guilty, as I need this reflection as much as anyone. But as we draw the focus on this habit to a close, I simply ask you to reflect on God's generosity and your own, and to respond to the question: Can I, hand on heart, say that I am a glad (cheerful) giver?

Carrying on the theme of reflecting, we are moving towards the season of Lent, and with that in mind I would like to offer the chance for us to pause and turn our thoughts to all that that means. So during Lent I would like to offer you a Lent course. It is based upon the film *The Greatest Showman* and looks at themes of hope and redemption. I am offering 2 sessions per week, and they will be interchangeable for those who need that flexibility. The first will be on Mondays at 2pm, venue the Antioch Room at Wesley Hall, starting just before Lent on the 4<sup>th</sup> March and running for 6 weeks to the 15<sup>th</sup> April. The second will be on Friday evenings at 7:30pm, The Manse, [REDACTED], and will start on the 8<sup>th</sup> March and run for 6 weeks until the 19<sup>th</sup> April. I do hope some of you will be able to join in with this. Before that, however, there will be a chance to gather to watch the whole film, and we will be showing this at Wesley Hall on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> March at 10:30am, with a chance for refreshments and a chat afterwards.

Lastly, if anyone has looked at the plan you will know that it has been difficult to find preachers and that there are more than the usual number of Local Arrangements planned. I understand that putting together a Local Arrangement can be daunting, and we certainly don't want or need all of them to be All Age, so I am offering you a chance to join me to do some thinking about how to plan a service and what needs to be in it. On Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> February at 10 am you can join me either in the Sanctuary or the Emmaus room (depending on numbers) and I will help you in thinking about how to creatively go about planning a service, and we will look at some of the services in the Holy Habits books. We will start with refreshments and then work to put a service together that could be used on the 17<sup>th</sup> February. This is open to anyone interested. You don't have to take an upfront role to be a part of the planning. In addition to this, on the 13<sup>th</sup> April at 10am there is a Circuit Conference at Wesley Hall, also looking at planning Local Arrangements.

So, we have a lot going on. God is at work among us. I pray you will know the deep blessings of the Spirit on the move.
