




❖ Gift Day 2024

We have committed our annual Gift Days to supporting the employment of both a Families Co-Ordinator and a Pre-teen & Youth Worker.

About a third of the income for the Children, Families and Youth Fund comes from our Gift Day. Our target for this year is £8,000, with £1,400 already received from those who make a regular







gift each month. However, we have not yet managed to secure all the grant funding we had hoped for, so if it is possible to increase your donation from last year, that would be fantastic, although we do completely understand that there are many other pressures on people's finances at the moment.

Faith Perspectives on the Middle East Crisis

You are invited to a meeting at St Mark's Church, Broomhill 7:00pm to 8:45pm this evening (Sunday 28th April) at which we will consider the current Middle East crisis from the point of view of the three religious faiths that are involved, Jewish, Muslim and Christian. How can a just and lasting peace be secured?

The meeting will begin with four short talks by the following speakers:

- Rev Dr Casey Strine, Senior Lecturer in Ancient Near Eastern History and Literature and the Bishop of Sheffield's Adviser on Inter Faith Relations - on Palestine as a Holy Land for three religions
- Dima Shami from Sheffield's Palestinian community.
- Professor Jane Ginsborg Chair of Seven Hills Shul, formerly Sheffield and District Reform Jewish Congregation.
- Mark James Kairos Sheffield, a network of Christians in Sheffield concerned and active for justice and peace in the Holy Land

These talks will be followed by Q&A and discussion. The meeting will end with a period of private prayer.

Cliff Festival 2024 runs from Friday 24th – Monday 27th May at Cliff College in Derbyshire. Expect morning and evening worship and Bible teaching, seminars, games and activities for people of all ages, opportunities to be reenergised and resourced for mission - and all in the stunning surrounds of the Peak District. The theme this year is Rerouted and the morning bible studies will be led by Matt Miofsky from the Gathering Church in Missouri. Other contributors will be announced shortly and closer to the event the programme will be available on the Cliff College website. They run excellent youth and children's work provision for children aged 2 and upwards.

There is the option to visit for the day as well as buying a ticket for the whole weekend (entry is free to all under 18s). Day passes are £25 for adults or £18 for concessions (65 or over/ students/ living with a disability or on benefits). We won't be having a service here at Wesley Hall on Sunday 26th May, so that would be a great opportunity to come and see what it is like!
