The dates are:


Thursday 10<sup>th</sup>, Friday 11<sup>th</sup> and Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November, from 11am to 7pm;

#### Wesley Hall Church Offering

This year (2022/23) the Circuit Assessment for Wesley Hall has increased to £31,150 but the amount that we expect from the offertory is £24,000. With Gift Aid, this brings the total offertory income to just over £28,150 which is £3,000 short of the Assessment figure. The Circuit support us by providing a Minister, admin support through the office, and grants towards our children, families and youth work, so it is important that we continue to pay our full contribution to the Assessment.

We are therefore asking that people prayerfully review their regular offering to the church, with a view to increasing it, if possible. We are very aware of the generosity of the congregation, especially with our ongoing commitment to funding Neil and Jane to support their outreach work. In the current economic climate, we fully understand that this might not be possible for everyone. Any other fundraising ideas will be gratefully received!

If you do not currently give regularly and would like to start, popular methods are standing order or weekly offering envelope. If you are a UK taxpayer, your gift can be increased by 25% at no extra cost to yourself using Gift Aid. If you have any questions about giving to church, please see our treasurer. Matt Irons.

#### Andrea at Mercy Ships

I very much appreciate the prayer support from so many of you. I am amazed at some of the truly incredible surgeries that are done on ship, especially the maxillofacial ones, where at times, dreadfully huge tumours are removed from a patient's face; then the patient's face has to be reconstructed because in order to remove the tumour, parts of the face have had to also be removed. Having listened to Dr Gary Parker, a surgeon who has worked on Mercy Ships for 35 years, give a very graphic presentation on how tumours are removed, and facial reconstruction done, I am truly amazed at the skill and knowledge needed to do such operations. Recently a patient was operated on for an incredible 16 hours to reconstruct parts of his face following the removal of a tumour in May. In the West, such tumours would have normally been removed as soon as they started to grow, but due to not having access to surgery because of the cost, the size of some tumours is truly horrendous.
